

Academic Council (AC)

The Academic Council convened to address key academic initiatives for the 2024-25 academic year. The revised Academic Regulation 2024-25 was considered and approved. A suggestion to incorporate 10-minute session breaks to enhance the learning experience was discussed; however, the university opted to maintain the existing break schedule to preserve a conducive learning environment and minimize classroom disruptions.

Discussions also focused on approving the Broad Curriculum Framework for various Academic Programmes of Joy University, which were developed based on recommendations from the respective Board of Studies. During these discussions, Dr. Sivalingam recommended actively promoting the use of NPTEL courses available through the SWAYAM portal. In response, NPTEL/SWAYAM courses are now being promoted and integrated into the curricula of various schools. Er. Rajababu Kumaravel proposed integrating mini-projects in every semester, along with microlevel projects and practical implementation of project development. This integration of mini/micro-projects is slated to begin in the next academic year. Er. Rajababu Kumaravel further suggested that students develop products or services for university

purposes or society to foster innovation and entrepreneurial skills. Student-led product development for the university and society is now being fostered through club activities.

Executive Council (EC)

The Executive Council considered and approved the Academic Regulations 2024-25, Examination Regulations 2024-25, and the Revised Constitution of IQAC, as framed and approved by the Academic Council. Prof. Dr. T. Murugesan recommended retaining the B.Com Honors program due to its alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP). In response to student demand, the B.Com (Honors) program will be offered starting from the next academic year. Prof. Dr. Krishnan Baskar suggested adopting an ABC (or similar) grading system to standardize evaluation across departments, and this system will also be implemented next academic year.

The council also considered and approved the Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes for the Academic Year 2024-25, based on the Academic Council's recommendations. Prof. Dr. Krishnan Baskar proposed adding foreign language programs like German, French, or Sanskrit to broaden students' academic horizons and improve global employability. The inclusion of foreign languages will be determined by admission demand for these programs in the next academic year.

Furthermore, the Executive Council discussed and approved the Broad Curriculum Framework for various Academic Programmes of Joy University, which were based on recommendations from the respective Board of Studies and approved by the Academic Council. Prof. Dr. T. Murugesan suggested including more industry professionals from each department in the Industry Advisory Panel to ensure diverse and comprehensive industry expertise. As per these suggestions, industry experts are being included from each department in the Board of Studies. Prof. Dr. Krishnan Baskar also proposed including Alumni in the University's advisory and decision-making processes. In line with council member requests, Raja alumni expertise is now systematically integrated into university decision-making through formal advisory forums.

Governing Council (GC)

The Governing Council reviewed and approved the Academic Regulations 2024-25, Examination Regulations 2024-25, and the Revised Constitution of IQAC, all of which were framed and approved by the Academic and Executive Councils. A significant resolution from this council was Professor R.K. Mittal's suggestion for the adoption of the ABC grading system. This change aims to align the grading system with UGC

standards, ensure compliance with NAAC and other accreditation bodies, improve the evaluation process, and prevent future accreditation and evaluation discrepancies. The ABC grading system, aligned with UGC standards and NAAC requirements, will be implemented starting next academic year.

Faculty Development Programs (FDPs)

Joy University is committed to fostering continuous professional growth among its faculty members through various development initiatives. The following Faculty Development Programs were conducted during the academic year, aimed at enhancing pedagogical skills, promoting research, and ensuring alignment with national educational standards.

Faculty Development Programme: Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment: An Integrated Design Approach for OBE as a TOTAL Teacher (July 8-9, 2024)

A two-day intensive Faculty Development Programme on "Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment: An Integrated Design Approach for OBE as a TOTAL Teacher" was organized on July 8th and 9th, 2024. This workshop focused on equipping participants with the skills to effectively implement Outcome-Based Education (OBE) within their curricular settings. The program aimed to help faculty elucidate the OBE framework, converse on the nature and development of higher-order thinking skills, formulate relevant course outcomes using Revised Bloom's Taxonomy, design interactive teaching strategies, and construct tools for outcome-based assessment. Key topics covered included the need and importance of OBE and Taxonomy-based education, teaching strategies and instructional design in OBE, formulation of outcomes in cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains, and the design of OBE curriculum. Practical workshops focused on formulating course outcomes aligned with Program Outcomes and choosing appropriate teaching and assessment strategies.

Faculty Development Programme: General Orientation (July 3, 2024)

On July 3rd, 2024, a Faculty Development Programme featuring Dr. A. John De Britto provided a comprehensive orientation for faculty members. The session covered crucial aspects of the university's operations and academic framework, including an overview of the TN State Private University — TN ACT 2019, various schools and programs offered, program structure, and existing collaborations with industry partners like IBM, Intel, and SIEMENS. Other key areas discussed were the credit system, the roles of the Board of Studies (BoS) and Academic Council, the academic

calendar, timetable and workload management, class timings, attendance policies, first-hour protocols, and facilities such as labs, English Lab, and the Library. The session also highlighted the importance of IQAC, documentation for the Annual Report, the role of the Exam Coordinator, and the encouragement of faculty and student participation in regional, national, and international conferences, workshops, seminars, and internships. Furthermore, discussions included clinical postings, field visits, school-wise celebrations, inspection and renewal processes, co-curricular and sports activities, club activities, student mentoring and coordination, student discipline, and the conduct of orientation for seniors and induction programs for freshers. The program also touched upon Annual Faculty Performance Appraisal, Result Analysis, Internal Audit, Research Paper publication, Research Projects, Ph.D. guidance, Alumni engagement, and participation in JU Committees.

Webinar Series for Faculty under Faculty Development Program (Commencing January 10, 2025)

A series of webinars under the Faculty Development Program has been proposed for this semester, with eminent educationists speaking on various relevant topics. This series commenced on January 10, 2025, with Dr. S. Senthilnathan, Director, UGC - Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre, Bharathidasan University, Trichy, delivering a session on "Effective Question Paper Setting". On January 11, 2025, Dr. Jamels James, Director, Pastoral Centre, Tirunelveli, addressed "Mentoring: Needs & Importance: Dealing with Adolescent". Subsequent webinars include "Creative Pedagogies: Inspiring original ideas among students" by Dr. J. John Love Joy on January 25, 2025, "Smart TLE" by Dr. V. Ashok Immanuel on February 8, 2025, "Outcome Based Education (OBE)" by Dr. V. Evelyn Brindha on February 22, 2025, and "Innovative Pedagogical Strategies for Enhancing Student Engagement" by Dr. N. Devaki on March 8, 2025. Faculty members on campus for the January 10th and 11th sessions assembled in the Boardroom, while others joined online, with mandatory attendance for all.

SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES

The School of Agricultural Sciences at Joy University had a productive 2024-2025 academic year, focusing on experiential learning, academic enrichment, and community engagement. With 65 students and 6 faculty members, the school actively participated in various educational visits, hosted impactful events, and celebrated significant faculty and student accomplishments.

Educational Initiatives

- Field Visits: Students gained practical exposure through visits to the Coconut Research Station (April 12, 2024), Floriculture Research Station (September 30, 2024), Agriculture Research Station (October 28, 2024), and NILA Cold Storage Facility (April 17, 2025). These visits focused on diverse areas like coconut farming, flower breeding, rice cultivation, and post-harvest management.
- Experiential Tour: A seven-day educational tour (February 17-23, 2025)
 across Tamil Nadu provided B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture students with hands-on
 learning at various agricultural institutions, covering crop production, pest
 management, and agri-tech innovations.
- Holistic Learning: A visit to Vivekananda Kendra, Kanyakumari (November 6, 2024), offered insights into organic farming, herbal gardening, and sustainable living, blending scientific knowledge with traditional wisdom.
- Guest Lecture: Dr. Shamina S. delivered an insightful guest lecture on "Role of Millets and Its Nutritive Value" (January 28, 2025), emphasizing their nutritional and environmental importance.

Academic & Curriculum Development

 Board of Studies Meetings: Two online Board of Studies meetings (September 13, 2024, and April 1, 2025) were held to refine the curriculum, reduce workload, redistribute courses, and incorporate new subjects and online learning modules for undergraduate and postgraduate programs.

Events & Community Engagement

- Food Fest: The School of Agricultural Sciences hosted a vibrant Food Fest (August 12, 2024), promoting culinary creativity, teamwork, and nutritional awareness among students through various themed cooking challenges.
- Swachh Bharat Abhiyan: In collaboration with university clubs, a cleanliness drive, tree plantation, and "Treasure Out of Trash" competition (October 2, 2024) fostered environmental awareness and community service.

- Community Outreach: Students participated in a community outreach
 program at Kuthenkuli Village (February 21, 2025), learning about seaweed
 cultivation, conducting a beach clean-up, and promoting hygiene awareness in
 a local school.
- "Forests and Water" Awareness: An event on March 26, 2025, featuring elocution and face painting, highlighted the crucial interdependence of forests and water resources.

Board of Studies Meetings Drive Curriculum Excellence

The School of Design successfully conducted two **Board of Studies (BoS)**meetings during the academic year 2024–2025 for its undergraduate programmes: **B.Des in Fashion Design** and **B.Des in Transportation and Automobile Design.** These crucial meetings aimed to review and refine the curriculum, ensuring alignment with industry standards, academic expectations, and future career trends.

The **second BoS meeting** took place on **March 6, 2025**, and addressed the curriculum for semesters 3 to 6. This session included **Dr. T. Balamurugan** (Dean – Academics) and **Dr. John De Britto** (Pro Vice Chancellor), with Mrs. J. Anit Rolinda coordinating and Prof. Dr. V. Ramesh Babu continuing as the external subject expert. The BoS reviewed advanced modules such as design research, studio electives, industry internships, portfolio development, and emerging technologies relevant to both disciplines.

Both meetings were highly constructive, emphasizing the integration of industry practices, sustainability, and innovation-oriented modules. The external expert commended the School's commitment to quality and progressive education. Suggestions for interdepartmental collaboration, skill-based workshops, and industry-driven capstone projects were also incorporated. These BoS meetings marked significant milestones in the School of Design's academic planning, ensuring a competitive, industry-relevant, and academically rigorous curriculum.

Industrial Visit: B.Des Fashion Design Explores Lulu Mall, Trivandrum

On **April 8**, **2025**, students from the B.Des Fashion Design programme embarked on an enriching **industrial visit to Lulu Mall**, **Trivandrum**, guided by faculty member **Mrs. J. Anit Rolinda**. The visit aimed to expose students to national and international fashion brands, their visual merchandising strategies, brand aesthetics, and consumer engagement within a commercial retail environment.

Students explored diverse brands like **H&M**, **Zara**, **Max**, **Allen Solly**, **Levi's**, **and FabIndia**, observing distinct design philosophies, color stories, garment styling, and layout designs that reflected brand identity. They also engaged with store managers to understand inventory management and seasonal collections.

A key focus was on analyzing **display techniques and visual merchandising**. This real-world learning experience connected academic theory with practical applications in fashion retail, enriching students' understanding of brand positioning

and marketing insights.

Participants then engaged in hands-on practice, applying methods to illustrate garments and accessories using markers, pencils, and watercolor.

The event concluded with a showcase of participant works and a feedback session, highlighting the practical nature of the training. The program was coordinated by Prof. Dr. Mary Christobel, Professor, School of Arts and Natural Sciences (SOANS), until February 2025, and is currently under the leadership of Prof. Dr. T. Johnsy Rani, Professor, School of Nursing (SON), from March 5, 2025, onwards. Aimed at fostering interdisciplinary learning and innovation, the event engaged 850 first-year engineering students from various disciplines. The sessions highlighted the significance of drone technology in sectors like agriculture, defense, and disaster management, while inspiring students to explore UAV-based innovations and entrepreneurial ventures.

Collage Making Competition - Design Thinking Hub

On 27th March 2025, the Design Thinking Hub organized a Collage Making Competition titled "A Day in the Life of a Joy University Student" at Room No. 204, Joveena Block. Seventeen students registered and twelve showcased creative collages highlighting their campus experiences. The event fostered visual storytelling, creativity, and self-expression. Top prizes were awarded to Hasta Behra and V Kannika Eswari.

Tamil Debate Competition - Public Speaking and Debate Club

On 27th March 2025, a Tamil Debate Competition was conducted at the Moot Court, School of Law. Fifteen students participated in a debate on the topic of media trials and their effect on judicial processes and press freedom. The event encouraged critical thinking, public speaking, and engagement with legal and ethical issues. Judges from the School of Law and Department of English evaluated arguments and delivery. Winners received certificates and books.

Industrial Visit to Tiliconveli Tech Park – Data Science Club
On 28th March 2025, the Data Science Club of the School of Computational
Intelligence organized a one-day industrial visit to Tiliconveli Tech Park in
Tirunelveli. Fifty-one students from the 1st and 2nd year BTech programs,
accompanied by Dr. Shyju Wilson (HOD, DCIS and Club Coordinator) and Mr.
Karuppiah (Executive, IQAC), participated. The students engaged with industry
professionals and attended an interactive session by the HR Manager of the Tech
Park. Discussions focused on career opportunities, recruitment processes, and the
growing demand for data science professionals. The visit inspired and motivated
the students, providing valuable insights into industry functioning and future job
prospects.

Hackathon Program - Horizon8 - Robotics and Automation Club (ROAM), School of Computational Intelligence

The Robotics and Automation Club, in collaboration with TANSAM (TIDCO), organized the 24-hour Horizon8 Hackathon on **April 16-17**, **2025**, at Joveena Block and Sardar Dr. S.A. Raja Convention Hall. Forty students from Tamil Nadu formed 8 teams to tackle industry challenges like AR/VR for vehicle maintenance. With expert mentors Hannah Robert and Sabari SB, participants engaged in coding and prototyping. A first-year SOCI team won second prize of ₹50,000. The event promoted innovation, collaboration, and entrepreneurship, supported by a ₹15 lakh prize pool and full hospitality.

Industrial Visit to ISRO Propulsion Complex – Design and Thinking Hub

On **2nd May 2025**, 48 students from the Design and Thinking Hub visited ISRO Propulsion Complex, Mahendragiri, to explore propulsion technologies used in

Indian launch vehicles. The visit included tours of the Cryogenic Engine Testing Centre, Assembly and Integration Bay, and Control Command Centre. Students attended expert presentations and engaged in interactive sessions with ISRO scientists, gaining insights into liquid and cryogenic rocket engines used in PSLV, GSLV, and LVM3 missions. The experience strengthened academic learning and inspired interest in aerospace careers. Faculty members Dr. S. Prabha, Dr. Arun Balaji P, and Dr. M. Harris guided the visit.

Industrial Visit to Kudankulam Nuclear Power Project - Design Thinking Hub

On 6th May 2025, 47 students from the Design Thinking Hub toured the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Project to understand nuclear reactor operations, particularly the Pressurized Water Reactor (PWR) technology. The visit included reactor training models, turbine halls, and simulation centres. KKNPP officials conducted detailed sessions on nuclear fission, electricity generation, and safety protocols. An interactive Q&A with senior engineers sparked interest in nuclear science and public sector careers. The visit enhanced students' practical knowledge and pride in India's energy progress. Faculty coordinators Dr. S. Prabha, Dr. T. Balamurugan, and Dr. Rahul accompanied the students.

Basic First Aid Awareness and Demonstration Session – Health and Wellness Club

A lecture and practical demonstration on *Basic First Aid* was conducted for hostel students by the Health and Wellness Club of JU on **10th May 2025**, from 10:00 am to 11:00 am at Soosai Block, Room No. 101. The session was led by Dr. Nandhu Krishnan, Medical Officer of JU, and Dr. M.S. Sundaram, Professor and Head of the Department of Physiotherapy, SOLHS.
